Those entries without e-mail addresses will receive a Final Entry Confirmation ONLY that will be sent via the USPS AFTER the entry closing date (February 15th). 4) If you include an e-mail address on your entry you will receive your Final Entry Confirmation via e-mail unless you specifically request otherwise. 5) The Secondary Closing Date is for changes in level ONLY (move-ups). Such requests MUST be made in writing (via e-mail is OK). You may NOT change programs or jump heights after the initial entry closing date of Feb. 15th.

NOTICE TO COMPETITORS

Through the submission of an entry, competitors acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of USDAA rules and regulations, as amended July 1, 2009 which are hereby incorporated by reference, including but not limited to the following rules of entry:

- **The Organizing Committee** of an event may refuse the entry of any competitor or dog for just cause should the committee view that participation by competitor or dog would be prejudicial to the sport. However, any committee so doing must notify the competitor in writing (with a copy to the USDAA office) in anticipation of or upon receipt of an entry. The notice must include the reason for refusing the entry and a brief explanation of the basis for the decision. The burden of responsibility for appropriateness of such action rests solely with the host group and its Organizing Committee.
- **This test is open** to all dogs being at least eighteen (18) months of age, including purebred and non-purebred, except bitches in season, dogs suffering from any deformity, injury or illness that may affect their physical or mental performance, or dogs exhibiting signs of aggression towards people or other dogs.
- **No leads**, collars, food, toys or other aids or devices shall be permitted on the course at any time, except as provided for in the USDAA Rules and Regulations. Safety shall always be of the foremost consideration in the actions and conduct of handlers at all times.
- **All dogs must be** registered with the USDAA in order to compete in sanctioned events. Additionally, all Junior Handlers must be separately registered with their dogs for participation in the Junior Handler program. To obtain a registration number immediately and a height card before the show, go online to www.usdaa.com, click on General Information, Dog Registration. Registration may also be made to this show on the form provided in this Test Schedule, or to the USDAA at PO Box 850955, Richardson, TX 75085-0955.
- **All competitors, through entry at this event**, waive any and all rights relative to video broadcast of this event. Competitors shall have the right to videotape portions of this event for their personal use only. No portion of this event may be videotaped for commercial or other purposes. All video, broadcast and telecast rights for this event are the exclusive property of the United States Dog Agility Association, Inc. Portions of this event may be taped for television. Through entry at this event, all competitors and handlers hereby grant to the USDAA and its representatives, agents and assigns, all rights and permission to use or appropriate the names of competitors and their dogs, as well as biographies, likenesses, photographs, voices, performing persona, or other indicia of identity for broadcast, telecast, cablecast, transmission or distribution in any format or media now known or hereafter to become known. All competitors and handlers hereby release the USDAA and its representatives, agents and assigns from any claim or cause of action for invasion of the rights of privacy, right of publicity, right of personality, or any similar right.

IN ADDITION:

- **THERE SHALL BE NO REFUNDS** for entries withdrawn after the closing date, or in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, or dismissed from the competition, regardless of reason for such dismissal, except that a dog or handler who suffers an injury and/or illness, or bitches that come into season after the closing date may be eligible for a refund of 50% of the total entry fee. Requests for said refunds must be received **IN WRITING (accompanied by appropriate documentation from a vet or doctor verifying illness or injury)** by the Test Secretary BEFORE the end of the test on Sunday, February 28th. In addition, no entry fee will be refunded if the test cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, strike or any other cause beyond the control of the event organizers.
- **BAD CHECK POLICY:** Any person who writes a check for "insufficient funds" and/or otherwise a "bad check" will not be allowed to participate in this event until such time that Feel the Rush Agility is reimbursed in cash, money order, or cashier's check for the full amount of said "bad" check plus any and all amounts charged by Feel the Rush Agility's bank AND a \$25 returned check charge. In the case where a "bad check" is not known at the time of the event, the competitor will be notified by mail to provide complete settlement of the amounts owed, along with any delayed payment fees charged by Feel the Rush Agility. If the settlement is not made within thirty (30) days from the date the notice is mailed, Feel the Rush Agility will notify the USDAA and all show results will be cancelled, all prizes and awards are to be returned for distribution to the valid winners and the involved registration numbers will be suspended from further competition until such time as any awards are returned. Under NO circumstances shall the "cancelled" results be reinstated. **All checks will be deposited on or near the closing date. Please plan accordingly.**
- **ENTRY FEES:** Entry fees are payable in US \$\$\$ only. Please check your math closely when you write your check. There will be no refunds for overpayments of \$10 or less. Entry Forms submitted with an underpayment of entry fees are not a valid entry and MAY BE RETURNED via the US Mail.

NOTICE TO COMPETITORS (CONT.)

- **FOR EXHIBITION ONLY ENTRIES (FEO):** FEO entries are not allowed. Dogs that measure up to a higher jump height will run first in the higher height, and may NOT run FEO.
- **PHONE CALLS:** Any phone calls returned or initiated due to questions with an improperly or illegible entry will be returned COLLECT. Improperly completed entries without a phone number or an e-mail address will be returned via the US Mail.
- **DISCIPLINARY ISSUES:** It is expressly understood that competitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs, family and guests. Any competitor whose dog(s), family, or guests create unnecessary disturbances or engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the Event Organizing Committee be asked to leave the show site. Entry fees will NOT be refunded. The Feel the Rush Agility Event Committee will review all disciplinary issues.
- **FAULT LIMITS** may be imposed where the number of entries so requires. The decision to impose fault limits will be made by the Event Organizing Committee and/or Judge(s) and will be communicated at the Judge's Briefing for each class.
- Weather permitting, a **WARM UP AREA** with a single practice jump will be provided for competitors. This jump will be located OUTSIDE near an entrance to the building. No other obstacles may be set up and/or used at the show site for training, warm-up, or any other purpose.
- **THE SHOW SITE WILL BE OPEN** to competitors for set-up at 7AM on Saturday and Sunday mornings.
- **ALL** competitors must check-in **BEFORE** their first run of the weekend.
 - If you sent in a copy of your permanent (yellow plastic) height card for **ALL** of your dogs entered at this event, or if a copy of your permanent height card(s) are "on file" with MainelyAgility then you may "self check-in". Just find the Self Check-in Notebook near the Scoretable, verify that your dog(s) USDAA numbers and jump heights are correct and "check" yourself in.
 - If your dog does not have a permanent (yellow plastic) height card or you did not send it in with your entry then you **MUST** check-in with the Trial Secretary or their designate **BEFORE** your first run and present either your permanent (yellow plastic) height card, a temporary (blue paper) height card with **3** signatures awaiting a CMJ measurement or a printout of your subscriber page from the USDAA web site/check-in letter issued by the USDAA indicating that your dog(s) are permanently carded.
 - If you do not have any of the above then your dog **MUST** be measured before checking in, unless your dog(s) is entered in the 26" Championship classes (22" Performance) then you do not need to have your dog(s) measured before you check-in. The judge will be available for measuring **ONLY** between 7AM and 7:45 on Saturday and Sunday AM with one exception. There will be an additional check-in/measuring period on Saturday afternoon for those competitors not entered in any regular class on Saturday but are entered in the GP/PGP Qualifier. Check your final entry confirmation for additional information about this.

Failure to check-in properly may result in the loss of any placements or qualifying scores earned at this event.

- Indoor, heated crating is available at the show site. It is in a **SEPARATE**, heated building. There should be adequate crating space for everyone as long as everyone plans ahead and doesn't use an excessive amount of space. No personal chairs in the crating area. Please plan to stack crates where possible. **X-pens will be allowed, but please only for at least 3 dogs.** Onsite parking is fairly close to the building entrance and you may "work out of your car" - again, this is a bit "weather dependant".
- **CLEAN UP:** **Cleaning up** after yourself and your dog(s) at the show site, and at the motel, is a **MUST**. The Event Committee may dismiss competitors who fail to clean up after their dogs. There shall be no refunds.
- **USDAA RULEBOOK:** An electronic version of the rule book may be obtained online at www.usdaa.com. Become a USDAA Website subscriber and have access to a printable version of the rule book AND much more information, including you dogs' records!
- **AGILITY OBSTACLES** shall be chosen from those described in the current edition of the Official Rules and Regulations of the United States Dog Agility Association, Inc.
- **MEALS:** The event committee will have food available for purchase at the trial site. There are also several fast food type restaurants within a short drive of the trial site.

TENTATIVE SCHEDULE OF EVENTS

The show site will be open to competitors for set-up at 7AM on Saturday and Sunday mornings.

There is NO early check-in or set-up for competitors on Friday evening.

Check-in and measuring will be from 7:00 to 7:45 AM on Saturday and Sunday. There will be an additional check-in/measuring period on Saturday afternoon for those competitors not entered in any regular class on Saturday but are entered in the GP/PGP Qualifier. Be sure and check your final confirmation for additional information about this. **ALL** competitors must check-in **BEFORE** their first run of the weekend.

Judging is tentatively scheduled to begin at 8:00 on Saturday and Sunday. It is the responsibility of each competitor to be aware of schedule changes and to be "at the gate" for your class. The tentative running order will be "small to tall" each day with Performance Program competitors running before Championship Program competitors in each class.

This schedule was accurate at the time of printing; however it is subject to change at the discretion of the Judges or the Event Organizing Committee. Any changes will be communicated to competitors in their Final Entry Confirmations which will be sent out after entries close on February 15th.

PROGRAMS OFFERED

Two certification programs will be offered at this event - Championship and Performance. Competitors may enter both Championship and Performance Program classes for which they are eligible; however, under NO circumstance may a dog be entered in the same Championship and Performance class on the same day at this agility test (i.e. standard at any level in both programs).

CHAMPIONSHIP PROGRAM

Starters Level: See chapter 5 of the USDAA Rule book.

Advanced Level: See chapter 4 of the USDAA Rule book.

Masters Level: See chapter 3 of the USDAA Rule book.

PERFORMANCE PROGRAM

Classes are offered at Level I, Level II, and Level III.

Generally these classes are run on the same courses used for the equivalent level in the Championship Program with the exceptions shown in the table "Performance Program" above.

Performance Dog I: See chapter 7 of the USDAA Rule book.

Performance Dog II: See chapter 7 of the USDAA Rule book.

Performance Dog III: See chapter 7 of the USDAA Rule book.

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

STANDARD CLASSES

A dog earning a qualifying score in a standard class will receive a leg towards its title in that level. A dog completing three clear rounds (no faults) under at least two different judges will earn the title at that level.

NONSTANDARD CLASSES

Gamblers, Jumpers, Snooker & Pairs Relay Classes: These nonstandard classes are scored and judged pursuant to the provisions of Chapters 6 & 7 of USDAA Rules and Regulations.

Gamblers: Consists of a course with no pre-determined route and each obstacle is assigned a point value. In the "opening" period the handler seeks to accumulate points by performing the obstacles of his/her choice in the time allotted. At the conclusion of the "opening" the handler attempts the "gamble", a sequence designated by the judge to be handled from a distance, for additional points.

Jumpers: Consists of a course of jumps and may include a tire and tunnels.

Snooker: Consists of an "opening" sequence of point collection similar to the Gamblers class followed by a closing sequence of a set pattern.

Pairs Relay: Consists of a standard course with one dog and handler running a portion of the course, followed by a baton exchange to a second dog and handler who run the second portion of the course. Partners must be from the same level and in the same height division, mini (Ch 12/16, Perf 8/12) or open (Ch 22/26, Perf 16/22). In the event only one dog is entered in a program/level, un-entered dogs or dogs from another program/level may NOT be recruited to form a qualifying pair. Relay is now required for titling at all levels of Performance.

GRAND PRIX OF DOG AGILITY® WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS AND PERFORMANCE GRAND PRIXSM CHAMPIONSHIPS - LOCAL QUALIFYING EVENT

All competitors regardless of competition level are eligible for entry into these events. The following general rules are provided for informational purposes only. A complete copy of the Tournament regulations may be found on the USDAA web site at www.usdaa.com.

- A qualifying score is now zero faults. One Q is required for entry into a Regional Championship event. Two qualifying scores are required for entry in the quarterfinals at the World Championships.
- Awards (GP and PGP): The first place qualifying winner in each jump height class shall be awarded a "bye voucher", permitting them to advance to the final round at a Regional Championship. A double overlay maroon and white ribbon (maroon and pink for PGP) will be awarded to all competitors receiving a qualifying score. Rosettes will be awarded to the 1st to 4th place finishers in each jump height.

Following are the jump heights for the Championship Program Classes. Performance Class entrants may jump one jump height lower than would be required in the Championship classes. The Performance Program jump heights are indicated in the table below in parentheses.

PRIZES AND AWARDS

- Standard and Non-Standard Classes: Placement rosettes will be awarded for 1st - 4th place in each class and each jump height, and to mini and open divisions in Pairs Relay. Maroon qualifying ribbons will be awarded to all those dogs earning qualifying scores. In addition, "New Title" rosettes will be awarded to all dog and handler teams that complete the requirements for a new title at this test.
- Grand Prix and Performance Grand Prix Qualifier: The first place qualifying winner in each jump height class shall be awarded a "bye voucher", permitting them to advance to the final round at a Regional Championship. A double overlay maroon and white ribbon (maroon and pink for PGP) will be awarded to all competitors receiving a qualifying score. Rosettes will be awarded to the 1st to 4th place finishers in each jump height.

From Rt. 15S: Exit 62 (Whitney Ave., North), turn right onto Whitney Ave., go app. 1.5 miles, turn left onto Sherman Ave. (Dunkin' Donuts), go 1.0 miles, then turn right on Corporate Ridge, Paws 'N Effect is at the end of the cul-de-sac.

From Rt. I-84: Exit onto Rt. 691, first exit (Cheshire, Rt. 10, south), follow Rt. 10 through Cheshire into Hamden (Rt. 10, Whitney Ave.), turn right onto Sherman Ave. (Dunkin' Donuts), go 1.0 miles, then turn right on Corporate Ridge, Paws 'N Effect is at the end of the cul-de-sac.
