CHECK-IN and MEASURING

Tentatively 7:00 - 7:45 a.m. You may **TAPE** or **PAPERCLIP** a copy of your yellow, permanent height card to your entry where designated. Those who send a copy of their permanent card may check themselves in. All dogs must be measured prior to being checked in UNLESS the dog is jumping 26" (22" Perf), the handler sent a copy of their permanent card with entry or presents a permanent card, temporary card with 3 measurements awaiting a CMJ or check-in letter issued by USDAA / print out of dog info page from subscriber account indicating the dog is permanently carded. Failure to do so may result in the loss of any qualifying scores or placements earned during this event. **Please DO NOT mail actual cards or copies of the blue cards.** Copies of the blue card will not be accepted with your entry **OR** at the trial for check-in. ***If you've sent your blue card to USDAA and have not yet received the permanent one, contact them for a check-in letter.***

PRIZES AND AWARDS

Ribbons will be awarded to dog/handler teams placing 1st through 4th in all classes in each respective jump height. All Pairs Relays will be awarded by Mini and Open divisions, 1st through 4th. Maroon qualifying ribbons will be awarded for qualifying scores.

NOTICE TO COMPETITORS

- Competitors, through submission of entry, acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of USDAA Rules and Regulations, as amended July 1, 2009, including but not limited to the following rules regarding entry, and will comply. USDAA's official Rules and Regulations are hereby incorporated by reference.
- This test is open to all dogs being at least 18 months of age including purebred and non-purebred, except bitches in season, dogs suffering from any deformity, injury or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance, or dogs exhibiting signs of aggression.
- To be accepted, entries must be complete, signed (by parent or guardian for minors), received by the closing date, and accompanied by the correct fees.
- All dogs must be registered with the USDAA (registration has "U" prefix) for participation in regular test and tournament classes. All Junior handler/dog teams must be registered with USDAA for participation in the Junior Handler Program classes. (registration has a "J" prefix). A registration form is enclosed with this Agility Test Schedule. This form must be completed and submitted with all entries that do not bear a valid USDAA registration number. To obtain a registration number immediately and a height card prior to the show, go online to www.usdaa.com, General Information, Dog Registration.
- All Competitors, through entry at this event, waive any and all rights relative to video broadcast of this event. Competitors shall have the right to videotape portions of this event for their personal use only. No portion of this event may be videotaped for commercial or other purposes. All video, broadcast and telecast rights for this event are the exclusive property of the United States Dog Agility Association, Inc.
- Portions of this event may be taped for television. Through entry at this event, **ALL COMPETITORS AND HANDLERS HEREBY GRANT** to USDAA and its representatives, agents and assigns, all rights and permission to use or appropriate his/her and their dogs name, biography, likeness, photograph, voice, performing persona, or other indicia of identity for broadcast, telecast, cablecast, transmission or distribution in any format or media now known or hereafter to become known. All Competitors and handlers hereby release USDAA and its representatives, agents and assigns from any claim or cause of action for invasion of the rights of privacy, right of publicity, right of personality, or any similar right.
- No leads or collars (except as allowed in the USDAA Rules), food, toys or other aids or devices shall be permitted on the course at any time.
- Safety shall always be of foremost consideration in actions and conduct by handlers at all times.
- The Organizing Committee of an event may refuse the entry of any competitor or dog for just cause should the committee views that participation by competitor or dog would be prejudicial to the sport. However, any committee so doing must notify the competitor in writing (with a copy to the USDAA office) in anticipation of or upon receipt of entry. The notice must include the reason for refusing the entry and a brief explanation of the basis for their decision. The burden of responsibility for appropriateness of such action rests solely with the host group and its Organizing Committee.
- Agility obstacles shall meet the requirements of USDAA Rules and Regulations.
- Fault limits may be imposed at the discretion of the organizing committee and judge.
- Competitors (handlers or their dog) may not enter any class held for title under a judge who resides in the same household or with whom they have trained in the past ten (10) days.

ADDITIONALLY

- A withdrawal after the closing date due to injury or illness of the entered dog, or for bitches who come into season after the closing date will be eligible for a refund minus USDAA and judging fees plus a service fee of \$5 if supported by a written notice from a veterinarian on letterhead or other imprinted stationery. In such instances the secretary **MUST** be notified no later than Friday of the trial weekend, with supporting documentation received by the following Friday. Any other withdrawals after the closing date will not be eligible for refund.
- **THERE SHALL BE NO REFUNDS** in the event a dog and/or handler are dismissed from competition, regardless of the reason for dismissal, or in the event that the test cannot be opened or completed for reasons beyond the control of the organizing committee.
- There will be no refund for overpayment of fees in the amount of \$10 or less/dog.
- Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry fee. There will be a \$30.00 service charge on all returned checks and repeat episodes may require future payment to be a M.O. or Cashier's Check. Payment of entry fees and services shall be made within 30 days of postmark of notice of returned check. Any fees not received within 30 days of notice will result in cancellation of event results for all classes for the registration numbers(s) of delinquent entry/entries. No reinstatement of results is possible. All awards must be returned within 10 days of notification, or the dog's registration may be suspended pending restitution. Any unpaid fees or shortfalls must be paid prior to the start of the event or entry is cancelled without recourse by owner/handler.
- Dogs must be properly kenneled (in crate or pen) or attended at all times.
- This event will be held indoors. There will be limited crating space available. **Unentered dogs will not be allowed in the building.**
- There **are no** electrical hook ups. No portable generators will be allowed in the building.
- There will be **NO** equipment familiarization at this event.
- Exhibition Runs (FEO) are permitted only for dogs that "measure up" into a higher height class than that which they entered; however, no qualifying scores or awards may be earned and no change in program is allowed.
- Competitors will be responsible for notifying the Gate Steward in case of ring conflicts.
- Crating in designated areas only.
- *Run Orders will be available on our web site after secondary closing only, NOT at the trial*

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

Levels, Divisions and Classes

Two certifications programs will be offered at this event – Championship and Performance. Competitors may enter both Championship and Performance Program classes for which they are eligible; however, under NO circumstance may a dog be entered in the same Championship and Performance class at this agility test regardless of day.

Non-Standard Classes – Gamblers, Jumpers, Snooker & Pairs

These non-standard classes are scored and judged pursuant to the provisions of Chapters 6 & 7 of USDAA Rules and Regulations.

Pairs is qualifying, required for titling at all levels of Performance and follows the same rules outlined in the rule book for the Championship program; dogs must be in the same level and height division, mini or open. In the event only one dog is entered in a program/level, unentered dogs or dogs from other program levels may not be recruited to form a qualifying pair.

Tournament Classes

2010 DOG AGILITY STEEPLECHASE® LOCAL QUALIFIER

Description: The “Steeplechase” is a two-round tournament with emphasis on speed. Each round will be conducted on a jumpers-style course that shall include at least two spread hurdles, a long jump and an A-frame and a minimum of ten weave poles. Either the A-Frame or weave poles shall be required to be performed twice. Top competitors as set forth below (see qualification and advancement) shall advance to Round 2 to compete for prize money and Tournament Top Ten points. Qualifiers as defined herein earn the right to enter either the quarterfinals or semifinals at the Dog Agility Steeplechase® championships to be held in autumn of 2010. This tournament is open to all competitors not entered in Performance Speed JumpingSM qualifier at this event regardless of titles earned.

Scoring: The tournament shall be conducted pursuant to USDAA Championship Program Starters level rules, except that scoring in each round shall be on a time plus faults basis, with a five-point penalty added to a competitor’s performance time for each occurrence of a fallen hurdle or missed contact; running the wrong course shall be scored as an elimination as defined under Masters rules. For purposes of qualification calculations, a competitive performance resulting in “elimination” as a result of performance error in the normal pursuit of a round* shall be included in the count of competitors “actually competing” in the qualifying score computations.

**The judge shall mark a score of “Withdrawn” rather than “Elimination” where a competitor is disciplined in accordance with Appendix C of the regulations because of an incident in the ring resulting in elimination, including but not limited to a courtesy warning by the judge, when such action is instituted. Withdrawals and absentees shall not be included in the number of competitors “actually competing”.*

Qualification & Advancement

Local Qualifiers: Qualification shall be determined based upon the Round 1 scores of the top three dogs in each jump height provided there are at least 5 scores each in the 12” and 16” height classes or 7 scores each in the 22” and 26” height classes. (Dogs scoring elimination are included in the number of dogs with scores) The top three scores shall be averaged and multiplied by a factor of 1.25 to determine the maximum qualifying score for each jump height. Only competitors with scores equal to or less than the maximum qualifying score in round 1 qualify.

In the event that fewer than five competitors actually compete in the 12” or 16” height classes, or seven competitors in the 22” or 26” height classes, the top three scores must be determined from the combined height division for small dogs (12” and 16”) OR large dogs (22” and 26”) to determine the maximum qualifying score for all dogs competing in that division in the manner described above.

If there are fewer than five competitors actually competing in the small dog division or seven in the large dog division, the top score from the division shall be used to calculate the maximum qualifying score. In this case, the top score shall be multiplied by a factor of 1.25 to determine the maximum qualifying score.

Qualifiers and placement winners (minimum of four, there is no maximum) in the height class are eligible to advance to Round 2 at a local qualifying event in order to compete for Top Ten points and prize money, provided they have finished the round with a score. Non-qualifying competitors running in Round 2 shall not be credited with a qualifying score regardless of their final standing and at the Regional level are not eligible to earn a bye based upon their score in Round 2. A finalist slot vacated by a competitor who has earned the right to compete in the final round shall be forfeited and no substitutions are allowed.

Regional Championships: The same process used for determining qualifying scores in Round 1 at the local qualifier will be applied in Round 1 at a Regional. To determine the maximum qualifying score in Round 2 at a Regional, the same method is applied, but the multiplier of 1.15 will be utilized. Any competitor in Round 2 with a score less than or equal to the maximum qualifying score as calculated in this manner will earn a 'bye' into the Steeplechase semifinals championships. Non-qualifying competitors are not eligible to run in Round 2 to satisfy numerical minimums. Any 'bye' that is earned may only be used by the handler/dog team who earned it and may not be transferred to another dog and/or handler.

Eligibility for Entry:

Regional Championships: A competitor must have one qualification at a local qualifier to be eligible to enter Round 1 of a Regional Championships.

World Championship Quarterfinals: Two qualifications, one of which may be from the first round of a Regional Championship will be required for entry.

World Championship Semifinals: Advancement from the quarterfinals by earning the equivalent of a qualifying score or by direct entry into the semifinal by having earned a 'bye' at a Regional Championship.

In regional and world championship events, where a competitor has qualifying scores in both Championship Program tournaments and Performance Program tournaments, a competitor must enter all Championship Program tournaments unless the total number of qualifications earned in all Performance Program tournaments is greater.

Awards:

Local Qualifiers: Prize money shall be computed based upon 20% to 40% (at club’s discretion) of the total entry fees to be allocated in accordance with the payout table below regardless of the size of entry in any height class.

Regional Championships: Prize money shall be computed based upon 30% of the total entry fees to be allocated in accordance with the payout table below regardless of the size of entry in any height class.

Allocable amounts to finalist positions that are not filled for any reason or allocable prize amounts less than \$3.00 shall not be paid.

2010 Performance Speed JumpingSM Tournament Qualifier

Description: This is a two-round tournament with emphasis on speed. Each round will be conducted on a jumpers-style course that shall include a long jump, an A-frame and a minimum of ten weave poles. Either the A-Frame or weave poles shall be required to be performed twice. All obstacles are set according to Performance specifications. Top competitors as set forth below (see qualification and advancement) shall advance to Round 2 to compete for Tournament Top Ten Points and prizes or awards. Qualifiers as defined herein earn the right to enter either the semifinals at the Performance Speed JumpingSM championships to be held in autumn of 2010. This tournament is open to all competitors not entered in the Steeplechase qualifier at the same event regardless of titles earned.

Scoring: The tournament shall be conducted pursuant to *USDAA* Championship Program Starters level rules, except that scoring in each round shall be on a time plus faults basis, with a five-point penalty added to a competitor's performance time for each occurrence of a fallen hurdle or missed contact; running the wrong course shall be scored as an elimination as defined under Masters rules. For purposes of qualification calculations, a competitive performance resulting in "elimination" as a result of performance error in the normal pursuit of a round* shall be included in the count of competitors "actually competing" in the qualifying score computations.

**The judge shall mark a score of "Withdrawn" rather than "Elimination" where a competitor is disciplined in accordance with Appendix C of the regulations because of an incident in the ring, including but not limited to a courtesy warning by the judge, when such action is instituted. Withdrawals and absentees shall not be included in the number of competitors "actually competing".*

Qualification & Advancement

Qualification shall be determined based upon the Round 1 scores of the top three dogs in each jump height provided there are at least 5 scores each in the 8" and 12" height classes or 7 scores each in the 16" and 22" height classes. (Dogs scoring elimination are included in the number of dogs with scores) The top three scores shall be averaged and multiplied by a factor of 1.25 to determine the maximum qualifying score for each jump height. Only competitors with scores equal to or less than the maximum qualifying score in round 1 qualify.

In the event that fewer than five competitors actually compete in the 8" or 12" height classes, or seven competitors in the 16" or 22" height classes, the top three scores must be determined from the combined height division for small dogs (8" and 12") OR large dogs (16" and 22") to determine the maximum qualifying score for all dogs competing in that division in the manner described above.

If there are fewer than five competitors actually competing in the small dog division or seven in the large dog division, the top score from the division shall be used to calculate the maximum qualifying score. In this case, the top score shall be multiplied by a factor of 1.25 to determine the maximum qualifying score.

Qualifiers and placement winners (minimum of four, there is no maximum) in the height class are eligible to advance to Round 2 at a local qualifying event in order to compete for Top Ten points and prize money, provided they have finished the round with a score. Non-qualifying competitors running in Round 2 shall not be credited with a qualifying score regardless of their final standing and at the Regional level are not eligible to earn a bye based upon their score in Round 2. A finalist slot vacated by a competitor who has earned the right to compete in the final round shall be forfeited and no substitutions are allowed.

Program eligibility in Regional and National/World Championships shall be determined as follows: Where a competitor has qualifying scores in Championship Program tournaments and Performance Program tournaments, a competitor must enter all Championship Program tournaments unless the total number of qualifications earned in all Performance Program tournaments is greater.

Eligibility for Entry into the Championships: Two qualifying scores as defined herein are required to enter the semifinals at the Performance Speed JumpingSM Championships to be held in autumn of 2010.

Awards:

Local Qualifier: Prizes or awards shall be provided at the club's discretion.

Local Qualifier held in conjunction with a Regional Championship: Prizes or awards shall be awarded to first through third places in each jump height. Should prize money be awarded, the following table shall be utilized:

*Allocable prize money to Round 2 positions that are not filled for any reason shall be forfeited.
